Meeting was called to order at 9:15. Jimmy Sanders opened in prayer.

Fall Minutes from 2013 were presented by Joyce Wyatt. Michael McKnight made motion to accept. Second by Jimmy Sanders. Passed unanimously.

Financial Report from 2014 was presented by Joyce Wyatt. Discussion pursued on the high cost of trophies for Shooter of Year, State 3D, and Regional Competitions. Monies collected and trophy cost will be monitored closely. Michael McKnight made motion to accept Financial Report. Seconded by Dale Smith. Passed unanimously.

Dale Smith presented NFAA report. Highlights–The NFAA range and KOA Campground in Yankton, SC is a great venue to visit. 2015 NFAA meeting will be in Yankton, SD in April. For the National Vegas Shoot classes were reduced for cubs and youth age divisions. Adult entry fees for the National Vegas Shoot were raised to \$200. NFAA is recognizing the lower 12 ring on 3D targets as the official 12 ring to score.

Brock Morris noted that the SCAA link on the NFAA website was not active.

Benefits of being a member of the NFAA were discussed including receiving quarterly archery magazine, participating in NFAA sanctioned archery tournaments, and insurance benefits. More details on the benefits can be found on the NFAA website <https://www.nfaausa.com/benefits>.

NFAA Coaching Certification is being phase into USA Archery Coaching Certification.

David Chumley presented to pay Joyce Wyatt for the three years of service as secretary \$200 for each year of service as according to the Constitution and By–laws. This is supposed to be done yearly and was an oversight. Motion made by Keowee. Seconded by Swamp Fox. Passed unanimously.

Tammy Carter introduced herself and presented her plan for expanding archery opportunities in the state through the ASA State Federation. She encouraged clubs to consider hosting ASA 3D Qualifiers. She spoke about her past shooting experiences at the SCAA clubs and hopes to make it to each club this coming year.

Discussion pursued on SCAA Officers. Highlights– Joyce Wyatt, Sec/Treasurer, and Jimmy Sanders, Webmaster and Lower Regional Representative, are resigning from their positions. At this point no one has volunteered for the Secretary/Treasurer position. Dayton Colie volunteered for webmaster. Skylar Murray volunteered for Lower Regional Representative. There was discussion concerning Skylar’s being a youth. David Chumley and Jimmy Sanders will support her when needed. Michael McKnight made motion to appoint Dayton Colie as Webmaster. Second by Sandune. Passed Unanimously. Michael McKnight made motion to appoint Skylar Murray as Lower Regional Representative. Second by Keowee. Passed Unanimously. David Chumley will see that the roles of secretary/treasurer are completed until the position is filled.

Discussion pursued on concerns with the Regional Competition. Motion was made by Sandune to change the number of tournaments for regional from any club tournament to 2 tournaments at each club. Seconded by TAB. Passed unanimously. Due to this change, Lower Regional Representative will now be Regional Representative and track scores from both regions.

Steve Coleman presented an idea to combine the Field and Hunter Rounds into a 2 day shoot or to do half rounds of Field and Hunter with a 14 target Animal Round. Motion was made by Joyce Wyatt to combine Field and Hunter into a 2 day event. Seconded by Keowee. Yeas– Keowee, Joyce Wyatt. All others opposed. Motion denied.

Motion made by Wildlife Action to set the dates for State Tournaments so they will be scheduled about the same time every year. Seconded by Michael McKnight. Passed Unanimously.
